- Between 2010 and 2015 alone Enugu Ezike earned 1,513,500,000 from sale of 225000 bags of palm kernel
- In 2022 FGN reduced oil importation by 22% from \$500 million to 425\$ million.
- Nigeria largest producer of palm oil in the 1900s with the south east region accounting for much of the output.

Enugu State Yield¹: over 4 tons/ha National Yield average²: **0.48 ton/ha**

Enabling Factors

- Highest land productivity in Nigeria
- Existing experienced industrial cotton farm.

Key Facts

- Cotton yields less than 0.7 ton/ha across producing states except Kaduna where yield is 3.20/ha³.
- 300,000 metric tonnes produced in Nigeria in 2021⁴
- Nigeria has one of the world's largest deposit of cotton
- Cotton contributed up to 25% of Nigeria GDP in the 1980s⁵
- Mayco and BT specie the best specie of cotton






